



## Protect Your Pet from Pesticides

The quest for the perfect garden and lawn through the use of pesticides can poison your pet and have long-term impacts on your pet's health.

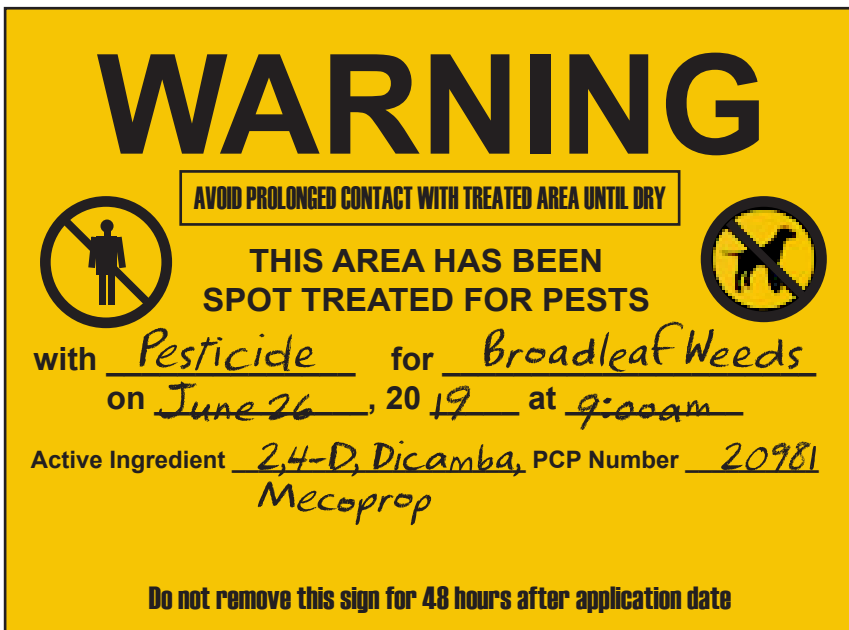
Pesticides include insecticides, herbicides and fungicides that are used to kill insects, weeds, plant diseases and other pests.

Exposure to your pet can occur in more than just your own yard. Your neighbor's use of pesticides, use of pesticides on public land, schoolyards and boulevards and even pesticides brought indoors from foot traffic can have a harmful effect on your pet.

### Yellow Pesticide Applied Indicator Signs

Signs are 16 inches X 24 inches and are posted around specific areas indicating exactly where the pesticide has been applied.

These signs have all the information pertaining to the product used at the specific location, what pest was being treated, the date and time of application, the active ingredient of the product applied, and the Pest Control Product (PCP) number\* associated with the product.



### Pesticide Poisoning - Some Symptoms

- Drooling
- Seizures
- Muscle twitching
- Vomiting
- Unsteady gait or stiffness
- Breathing difficulties
- Weakness
